

Sales Tax -As required by the Government Accounting Standards Board, sales tax is reported for the month it is collected by the vendor. December revenues are remitted to the City in February. Sales Tax received in December represents October collections. Sales Tax is allocated 25% to the Industrial/Economic Development Corporation, 8.33% to reduce Property Tax, and 66.67% to the City.  Interfund Transfers In include \$75,000 from the Utility Fund.	Non-Departmental expenses include interfund transfers. Outgoing Interfund Transfers include \$33,083 to the Insurance Fund and \$16,217 to the Capital Replacement Fund.  Tax Assessment & Collection expenses includes payment to Titus County to collect property taxes.  Due to 26 pay cycles within a year, January payroll expenses are higher than the typical month. 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### Revenues

Operating revenues are determined by the water and wastewater rates, as well as, the volume of water sold and wastewater treated. These revenues are highly influenced by weather patterns.

Water and Sewer Charges: the rates are determined by the December 2023 Rate Study as adopted in Ord. 2023-27.

### Expenditures

Non-Departmental expenses include interfund transfers of \$75,000 to the General Fund, \$33,334 to the Streets Fund, \$16,883 to the Capital Replacement Fund, and \$5,825 to the Insurance Fund.

Most Debt Service payments are made in November and May. Texas Water Development Board Debt Service payments are in March and September.

Due to 26 pay cycles within a year, January payroll expenses are higher than the typical month. This extra pay cycle is reflected across all departments.



### Civic Center Fund






## Sales Tax Collections by Month

An application has been submitted by property owner Richard Hess to allow construction of a farm implement storage structure that would use shipping containers for its sides to be erected on a tract of ranch land zoned Future Development (FD) adjacent to 1040 E 16<sup>th</sup> Street.

Because the property is zoned FD, City Council is charged in Section 155.06 of the code of ordinances with making specific use determinations in that zoning district, as it is intended to be a holding district for annexed property. Agricultural uses are allowed, however shipping containers as storage uses are not specifically allowed, only being in commercial and industrial zones. However, as the applicant is proposing they be used as sides of his implement storage structure according to a design package that he purchased for his agricultural equipment, he was directed to apply for the specific use permit process and requested an allowance recommendation from Planning and Zoning Commission and permission from City Council. The action requires City Council approval of a zoning ordinance for the specific use.

Staff has proposed, and Mr. Hess has agreed that the following conditions be included:

- The construction of the structure shall be properly permitted and shall conform to the City of Mount Pleasant Building and Fire Codes as adopted.
- 2) That the use will be limited solely to agricultural implement and equipment storage incidental to the agricultural use of the property.

Staff is recommending the approval of this Specific Use Permit for agricultural use on the property. On a 3-0 unanimous vote, the Planning and Zoning Commission voted to recommend approval of this Specific Use Permit as presented by staff at its February 11<sup>th</sup> meeting. Public notices were sent out and we received 0 responses. The letter and addresses are attached.

Property owners of industrial and commercial tracts as well as FD agricultural properties within 200 feet of the subject property were notified. No responses have been received.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNT PLEASANT, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 155 ZONING CODE, SECTION 155.45 SPECIFIC USE PERMIT REGULATIONS, OF THE CITY OF MOUNT PLEASANT, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, SO AS TO SPECIFICALLY ALLOW STORAGE CONTAINERS BE USED AS THE SIDES OF A AGRICULTURE EQUIPMENT SHELTER LOCATED IN FD (FUTURE DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT) ON THE PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS A 10-ACRE TRACT OF LAND DESCRIBED AS DANIEL MCCALL SURVEY 357, TRACT 920, CITY OF MOUNT PLEASANT, TITUS COUNTY TEXAS, AND MORE FULLY DESCRIBED HEREIN BY EXHIBIT 'A'; PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has received a request from Richard Hess for the approval of a Specific Use Permit for an accessory structure for farm implement and equipment storage utilizing a design incorporating storage containers on ranch land located on a 10-acre tract in FD (Future Development) zoning district in the Daniel McCall Survey 357, Tract 920 City of Mount Pleasant, Titus County, Texas, located adjacent to 1040 E 16<sup>th</sup> Street, and being more fully described in Exhibit 'A' of this ordinance, which hereinafter shall be referred to as the Subject Property and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Mount Pleasant and the governing body of the City of Mount Pleasant in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Mount Pleasant have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to all persons interested in and situated in the affected area, and in the vicinity thereof, and the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion, has concluded that the subject property's zoning should be amended as follows:

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNT PLEASANT, TEXAS:

**Section 1.** That the Code of Ordinances Chapter 155 Zoning Code, Section 155.45 Specific Use Permit Regulations of the City of Mount Pleasant, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended so as to grant a Specific Use Permit (SUP) allowing an accessory structure for farm implement and equipment storage utilizing a design incorporating storage containers be allowed to be constructed on vacant ranch land in a FD (Future Development District) on the Subject Property; and

**Section 2.** That the Subject Property shall be developed and/or used only in the manner and for the purposes described in this Specific Use Permit (SUP) ordinance and as stipulated by the Code of Ordinances Chapter 155 Zoning Code, Section 155.06 B(4) and 155.20 FD (Future Development District) as heretofore amended, as amended herein by granting of this zoning change, and as may be amended in the future and shall be subject to the following conditions and compliance standards:

#### 2.1 Operational Conditions

The following conditions pertain to the placement of an accessory structure for farm implementation and equipment storage utilizing a design incorporating storage containers on ranch land on the Subject Property, and conformance to these operational conditions are required for continued operations:

- 3) The construction of the structure shall be properly permitted and shall conform to the City of Mount Pleasant Building and Fire Codes as adopted.
- 4) The use will be limited solely to agricultural implements and equipment storage incidental to the agricultural use of the property.

**Section 3.** That the official zoning map of the City be corrected to reflect the changes in zoning described herein.

**Section 4.** That all ordinances of the City of Mount Pleasant in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict.

**Section 5.** That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of a fine not to exceed the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for each offense and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense;

**Section 6.** That if any section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section, paragraph, or provision to any person, firm, corporation or situation is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section, paragraph or provision to any other person, firm, corporation or situation, nor shall adjudication affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of the Code of Ordinances and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions for this ordinance are declared to be severable;

**SECTION 7.** That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption of said ordinance as the law in such cases provides.



Water Rate increases effective April 2025.

### **Item Summary:**

The City of Mount Pleasant has a Water Purchase Contract with the City of Winfield dated April 2019. The City of Mount Pleasant meters Winfield water usage through a single master meter. The City bills Winfield monthly for the usage. Winfield manages its own distribution system and bills their own customers.

In the spring of 2024 City Council adopted a 5-year rate increase matrix which included rate increases for Winfield. The adopted increase for Winfield for 2025 is \$3.40 per 1,000 gallons usage. The current rate is \$2.90 per \$1,000 gallons usage.

The letter provides notice to the City of Winfield that we will begin billing the new rate in April of 2025. Upon receipt of this notice the City of Winfield Council will meet to discuss and vote to raise rates for their customers in order to collect the revenue required to pay for the increased rates charged by the City of Mount Pleasant. The April billing provides them ample time for City Council to adopt new rates and process the new rates into the billing cycle for their customers.

City of Winfield Mayor Curitt,

In 2024 the City of Mount Pleasant adopted a 5-year water rate plan and rate increases for each year of the 5-year period. The adopted rate for Winfield remained at \$2.90 per 1,000 gallons of water usage in 2004, the same rate as was charged in 2023.

The City of Mount Pleasant adopted a water rate increase for the City of Winfield of \$3.40 per 1,000 gallons of water usage for 2025.

This is a notification that beginning in April 2025 you will be billed the new water rate of \$3.40 per 1,000 gallons of water usage. The timing of the April bill will be consistent with your normal billing cycle. 




