BACKGROUND: The current Industrial Park Lift Station is at maximum capacity with the addition of Local Bounti to the sewer system. The Industrial Park Lift Station Project is the replacement of a 6-inch force main with an 8-inch force main. The removal of the existing wet well and the installation of a larger well for more capacity with larger pumps to handle the higher flow. Lastly, the installation of an onsite generator for backup power and a new privacy fence to enclose the larger footprint of the well. In doing this project this increases the sewer systems capacity in the area to promote future growth.

STATUS OF ISSUE: The project is on schedule to be complete by the end of the year. The 8-inch force main has been installed. The old lift station has been taken out of service, the sewer system has been put on bypass pumping, and the new lift station is currently being built. This is a pay request for work performed during the month of October, portion of the cost of the bypass pumping, lift station improvements, lift station coating, and electrical improvements.

STATUS OF ISSUE: The project is on schedule to be complete on schedule. To date almost 40,000 ft of pipe has been installed including 2 almost complete lift stations. There are a few thousand feet left to install and the decommission of three lift stations. They had a few bores left to do which includes I-30 to get to the Anderson property. The amount payable this month is 938,123.48, which again is higher than other payments but this includes an add on to the current project. Wicker replaced 500 ft of bad raw water line for the city that should extend the life of our raw water lines, to give the city more time to decide a route to go with future plans with the raw water lines. 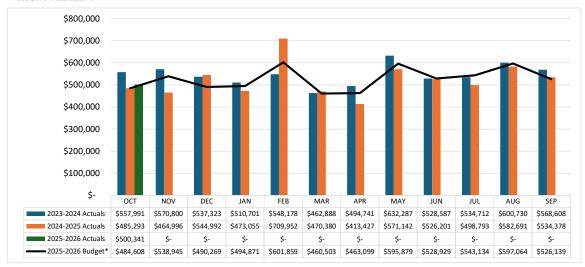

BACKGROUND: The Mount Pleasant Public Library has been awarded a \$16,000 grant from the Ladd and Katherine Hancher Library Foundation. The foundation provides funding to libraries in Texas for various projects and improvements. The grant will be used to purchase new furniture for the children's area and to expand the collection of large print and Spanishlanguage adult books.

STATUS OF ISSUE: The funds have been received in the form of a check. The budget modifications and check deposit are awaiting Council approval.

BUDGET: The funds awarded from this grant will be used to purchase replacement furniture and large print and Spanish-language adult books. We are currently exploring different vendors for the furniture to maximize grant funds while selecting quality pieces.

This budget amendment will increase allocations in the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Budget for Grant Income and Expense in the Library Grants Fund. This will allow the grant money to be added to and expended from the books.

The legal firm of Perdue Brandon Fielder Collins and Mott LLP has begun handling delinquent tax sales recently for the city having replaced Tim Taylor's longtime practice for non-payment of taxes and subsequent property sales. The firm recently contacted the city to discuss adding a tax lien collection service to help recoup lien amounts for property maintenance cleanup services costs the city had incurred. Billing and lien cross-referencing are services not otherwise offered. Reimbursement is an additional 20 percent charged above what is due, added to the total paid by the owner for each lien released

Financial Impact:

This item will have minimal impact on the city's budget as fees are raised from an additional 20% contingency fee added to the tax lien amount owed directly by citizens who have incurred liens when they are paid, so no direct payment from the city is required.

BACKGROUND: The legal firm of Perdue Brandon Fielder Collins and Mott LLP has begun handling delinquent tax sales recently for the city having replaced Tim Taylor's longtime practice for non-payment of taxes and subsequent property sales. The firm recently contacted the city to discuss adding a tax lien collection service to help recoup lien amounts for property maintenance cleanup services costs the city had incurred. Billing and lien cross-referencing are services not otherwise offered. Reimbursement is an additional 20 percent charged above what is due, added to the total paid by the owner for each lien released.

STATUS OF ISSUE: Texas Communities Group is an administrator partnering with the law firm to provide the services. They presented a power point outlining the program they provide in an agenda discussion item at the November 4th City Council meeting. Council members had the opportunity to hear about the program and ask questions.

BUDGET: This item will have minimal impact on the city's budget as fees are raised from an additional 20% contingency fee added to the tax lien amount owed directly by citizens who have incurred liens when they are paid, so no direct payment from the city is required.

OPTIONS: The staff supported option is to only add the firm's services for lien collection and noticing, but to keep the city's lien recordation and payment release process as is currently in place with city staff handling those duties. There is an optional available process with an additional cost per lien if the city were seeking to utilize the firm for the recordation/release processes that city staff does currently. This is not recommended at this time to keep city costs down.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of the Municipal Lien Collection contract and Ordinance with the firm of Perdue Brandon Fielder Collins & Mott LLP as presented.

NOTICE PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SEC. 2254.1036

WHEREAS, the City of Mount Pleasant ("City",) will consider entering into contingent fee contracts with the law firm of Perdue Brandon Fielder Collins & Mott LLP ("Firm") and hereby posts this notice pursuant to Sec. 2254.106 of the Government Code.

WHEREAS, this notice shall be posted before or at the time of giving the written notice required by Government Code Sec. 551.041 for a meeting described by Sec. 2254.1036(2) of the Government Code and shall announce the following:

- A. The City is pursuing a contract with the Firm for the collection of delinquent municipal liens owed to the City and through this contract the City seeks to increase recovery of its delinquent debts in as expeditious a manner as possible. GOVT. CODE § 2254.1036(1)(A).
- B. The City believes the Firm has the competency, qualifications, and experience necessary to fulfill these contracts. GOVT. CODE § 2254.1036(1)(B). The Firm has collected delinquent government receivables for nearly 50 years, including the collection of delinquent fines and fees, utility accounts, and municipal library accounts. The Firm currently has 12 primary offices and multiple satellite offices throughout Texas, Oklahoma, and Florida. It employs more than 400 individuals, including 52 attorneys. It uses a multi-office, fully integrated team approach allowing the City access to all its offices and resources. Its collection team consists of long-term Firm employees, including attorneys, call center associates, paralegals, law clerks, legal secretaries, collection support personnel and information technology experts. The Firm utilizes proprietary collection software that can be tailored to meet any special need the City may have. This proprietary software also automates many aspects of the collection process, such as: account/debtor research, mailings, and phone calls, return mail and address updates, payment notification and processing and workflow.
- C. The nature of any relationship between the City and the Firm is as follows. GOVT. CODE § 2254.1036(1)(C): The Firm currently represents the City in regard to its delinquent ad valorem tax collections and its delinquent fines and fees.
- D. The City is unable to perform collection of its delinquent municipal lien accounts. GOVT. CODE § 2254.1036(1)(D). The City currently does not have adequate support staff, computer software/programming, or experience to internally conduct these collection services and acquiring these will result in substantial expense to the City.
- E. These collection services cannot be provided for an hourly fee. GOVT. CODE § 2254.1036(1)(E). The collection of delinquent liens is a high-volume practice, requiring a significant amount of research, mailing, and handling of outbound/inbound calls. An hourly fee for such work will likely exceed the amount of delinquent liens due.
- F. The City believes this contingent fee contract is in its best interest. GOVT. CODE § 2254.1036(1)(F). Under the contingent fee contract, the Firm will be paid the amount of the percentage-based collection fee, regardless the number of hours the Firm spends researching, contacting, and mailing to collect the delinquent debt.

Written Findings as to the Collections Contract with Perdue Brandon Fielder Collins & Mott LLP:

In an open meeting, the City Council for the City of Mount Pleasant considered all matters listed in Section 2254.1036(a)(1) of the Government Code, as they relate to contingent fee contracts with Perdue Brandon Fielder Collins & Mott LLP.

The City Council for the City of Mount Pleasant, pursuant to Section 2254.1036, of the Government Code, hereby finds the following to be true: 1) there is a substantial need for the legal services specified in said contracts; 2) these legal services cannot be adequately performed by the attorneys and supporting personnel of the City of Mount Pleasant; and 3) these legal services cannot reasonably be obtained from attorneys in private practice under contracts providing only for the payment of hourly fees, without regard to the outcome of the matter, because of the nature of the matter for which these services will be obtained or because the City of Mount Pleasant does not have funds to pay the estimated amounts required under contracts providing only for the payment of hourly fees.

Therefore, this City Council hereby approves the contracts by and between the City of Mount Pleasant and Perdue Brandon Fielder Collins & Mott LLP, for professional legal services regarding the collection of delinquent fines and fees to be paid in accordance with Article 103.0031(b), Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.

WHEREAS, the City of Mount Pleasant, pursuant to Subchapter A of Chapter 51, Texas Local Government Code, may adopt an ordinance that is for the good government, peace, or order of the municipality and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of a municipality, pursuant to Subchapter A of Chapter 54, Texas Local Government Code and Subchapter A of Chapter 214, Texas Local Government Code may enforce each rule or ordinance of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the public interest to ensure the prompt payment of delinquent utility accounts; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mount Pleasant has entered into a contract with a private firm to provide services for the collection of costs incurred by the CITY to bring any property into compliance with City Code, including assessments for the mowing of vacant lots, removal of trash and debris from lots, demolition of substandard structures and abatement of other nuisances;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNT PLEASANT THAT:

There shall be an additional fee of twenty percent (20%) imposed on all debts and accounts receivable from costs incurred by the CITY to bring any property into compliance with City Code, once a debt has been made of record in the office of the County Clerk.

CONTRACT FOR LIEN COLLECTION SERVICES

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF TITUS

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between the CITY OF MOUNT PLEASANT, acting herein by and through its governing body, hereinafter called CITY, and Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins & Mott L.L.P., hereinafter called FIRM.

I.

CITY agrees to employ and does hereby employ FIRM for collection of delinquent accounts receivable, including the costs incurred by the City or authorized by the City Code to be imposed by the City to bring any property into compliance with the City Code, including, assessments for the mowing of vacant lots, removal of trash and debris from vacant lots, demolition of substandard structures, and abatement of other nuisances by the City pursuant to the terms and conditions described herein.

The City further authorizes the FIRM to execute all legal documents that are reasonably necessary to pursue collection of the City's claims in connection with the collection of delinquent accounts receivable that are subject to this contract.

This contract supersedes all prior oral and written contracts between the parties regarding delinquent accounts receivable and can only be amended if done so in writing and signed by all parties. Furthermore, this contract cannot be transferred or assigned by either party without the express written consent of all parties.

The FIRM will subcontract this contract, as necessary, with TEXAS COMMUNITIES GROUP, LLC., hereinafter TCG, to perform duties as deemed necessary by the FIRM.

II.

CITY agrees to refer delinquent accounts at the discretion of the CODE ENFORCEMENT DEPARTMENT by electronic or magnetic medium, in the specified format, to Perdue for collection, or by any other means of providing the FIRM and its subcontractor, TCG with this information, in a method agreed upon by all parties. An account is considered delinquent once a lien has been made of record in the office of the County Clerk. City will provide Perdue with copies of, or access to, the information and documentation necessary to collect the liens that are subject to this contract.

FIRM reserves the right to return to the CITY all accounts not collected within one year of referral by the CITY or identified as being in bankruptcy. Upon return of these accounts, neither party will have any obligation to the other party in this contract.

At least once each month on a date or dates agreed upon by the parties, the CITY will provide FIRM with copies of, or access to, the information once a lien has been made of record in the office of the County Clerk and necessary to collect the Delinquent Accounts Receivable that are subject to this contract. The CITY shall furnish the information to FIRM by electronic transmission, magnetic medium, or copies of physical records.

The FIRM shall forward to the City copies of any correspondence regarding a disputed lien amount due received from a property owner and the request for verification of the lien amount due. The CITY will provide FIRM within ten days of the receipt for the request for verification of the lien amount due, copies of all records which will verify the lien amount due which in turn will be forwarded to the account owner by the FIRM. All collection activity will be suspended on any disputed lien amount due until the appropriate verification of the lien amount due is delivered to the account owner.

III.

FIRM will direct all payments received by the FIRM and/or TCG collected at any CITY approved pay point to the CITY by any means approved by all parties to this contract deemed efficient and safe. The FIRM and/or TCG will prepare a Release and record the Release when necessary after the lien or assessment has been collected in full or set aside via any foreclosure action taken by the FIRM. Fees collected will be withheld from each payment received and invoiced to the CITY. FIRM reserves the right to return all accounts not collected within one (1) year of referral by CITY, as well as any accounts identified as being in bankruptcy. Upon return of these accounts, neither party will have any obligation to the other party to this contract.

The FIRM shall forward all cashier checks or money order payments made payable to the CITY and any correspondence from account owner directly to CITY. Firm may also direct the account owner to the City's credit card vendor for payment. Firm will invoice CITY for liens collected and CITY shall remit payment to the FIRM for add-on fee included in liens collected by the FIRM.

IV.

CITY agrees to pay to FIRM

- (1) Zero percent (0%) of any lien where the FIRM has exhausted all tax remedy and the property has been foreclosed and/or sold or struck-off at Tax Sale.
- (2) A twenty percent (20%) add-on fee to defray the cost of collections, passed by municipal ordinance, of any lien amount collected towards a lien or assessment imposed by the CITY.

All compensation shall become the property of FIRM at the time of payment. The CITY shall pay to FIRM said compensation monthly by check.

FIRM and its subcontractor TCG agree to use commercially reasonable efforts to collect the delinquent liens and assessments turned over to FIRM and to provide legal advice to CITY when and if necessary.

VI.

This contract shall commence on the ____ day of _____, 2025, and end when both parties mutually agree; provided, however, that either party to this agreement shall have the right to terminate this agreement by giving the other party thirty (30) days written notice of their desire and intention to terminate this agreement.

In the event that the CITY terminates this contract, FIRM shall cease collections immediately upon written notification by the CITY and all accounts shall be returned to the CITY by FIRM.

VII.

For purposes of sending notice under the terms of this contract, all notices from CITY shall be sent to FIRM and its subcontractor TCG by certified United States mail, or delivered by hand or by courier, and addressed as follows:

VIII.

This contract is made and is to be interpreted under the laws of the State of Texas.

In the event that any provision(s) of this contract shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the invalidity, illegality or unenforceability of that provision(s) shall not affect any other provision(s) of this contract, and it shall further be construed as if the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision(s) had never been a part of this contract.

IX.

In consideration of the terms and compensation herein stated, FIRM and its subcontractor TCG hereby accepts said employment and undertakes performance of said contract as set-forth above.

X.

Pursuant to Chapters 2252, 2271, and 2274 of the Texas Government Code, the Firm verifies that it does not and will not for the term of this contract boycott Israel or energy companies; that it does not have a policy which discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association nor will it create such a policy for the term of this contract; and that it is not engaged in business with Iran, Sudan, or a foreign terrorist organization.

The State Bar of Texas investigates and prosecutes professional misconduct committed by Texas attorneys. If you have a complaint against or dispute with this firm involving professional misconduct, the State Bar's Office of Chief Disciplinary Counsel will provide you with information about how to file a complaint.

XI.

Every provision of this Agreement is intended to be severable. If any term or provision hereof is hereafter deemed by a Court to be illegal, invalid, void or unenforceable, for any reason or to any extent whatsoever, such illegality, invalidity, or unenforceability shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement, it being intended that such remaining provisions shall be construed in a manner most closely approximating the intention of the Parties with respect to the illegal, invalid, void or unenforceable provision or part thereof.

This contract is executed on behalf of CITY by the presiding officer of its governing body who is authorized to execute this instrument by order heretofore passed and recorded in its minutes.

This contract may be executed in any number of counterparts, and each counterpart s be deemed an original for all purposes. Signed facsimiles shall be binding and enforceable.	hal

As such it is important that the Mayor and City Council members attend community meetings and events, view projects and efforts in the City and in other communities, act as ambassadors for the City, attend educational and training events, and participate in other activities that the Mayor and City Council members deem appropriate so long as the activity is related to his or her service as the Mayor and City Council member of the City. Some of these activities may be in the City of Mount Pleasant and others may be outside the City.

Local Travel. Expenses incurred by the Mayor and City Council members for participation at events and traveling to such events at locations inside of Titus County are not reimbursable.

Distant Travel. Expenses incurred by the Mayor and City Council members when traveling outside of Titus County on behalf of the City for work as the Mayor or City Council member may be reimbursed in compliance with this policy. The Council Travel and Expense Reimbursement Requests form is attached hereto and will take effect immediately. Each reimbursement request must be signed by submitting individual (Mayor or Council member) (stamped signatures are not permitted) dated and submitted to the City Secretary.

All travel and expense reimbursements are subject to review and if approved by two council members who were not involved in the travel and subject to budgetary constraints. The City shall not reimburse the Mayor and the City Council for travel and expense reimbursements unless and until approved in accordance with this policy.

Errors found on Council Travel and Expense Reimbursement Requests before paid will be corrected before paid. The Mayor and City Council members will be notified immediately of any error found on his/her reimbursement request. If an error is found after the request has been paid, the discrepancy will be corrected and remedied by the affected party within ten (10) days after he/she has received notice of the error.

Eligible Expenses for Distant Travel Related to Service as Mayor or Council Member: Reimbursement shall be permitted to the extent of actual travel or expense for which the Mayor and the City Council member has incurred if necessary to his or her work as a representative of the City and only if supported with appropriate reimbursement request and substantiated with appropriate documentation, as follows:

- Loaner Vehicles. When traveling outside Titus County, the Mayor and Council Members are encouraged to utilize designated loaner vehicles owned or leased by the City when said loaner vehicles are available. Mileage will not be reimbursed when such loaner vehicles are used. If fuel is needed and purchased personally by the Mayor or Council Member, it may be reimbursed with appropriate proof of purchase, substantiating mileage traveled and a city business purpose.
- Use of Personal Vehicle. When traveling outside of Titus County, mileage may be reimbursed

for use of a personal vehicle that is owned or leased by the Mayor or City Council member. All such mileage shall be by prudent and economic means. All such mileage shall be reimbursed at the applicable business standard mileage rate authorized by the Internal Revenue Service and such reimbursement to be made consistent with applicable Internal Revenue Service rules and substantiating mileage traveled and a city business purpose.

- Car Rental. When traveling outside Titus County for a city business purpose requiring car rental, car rental fees and gasoline costs for mid-size or full-size vehicles are permitted based on the Mayor and City Council member's physical requirements and/or the number of passengers to be accommodated. The Mayor and City Council members may upgrade at their own expense with quotes for the rate difference included in the expense report.
- Transportation Fees. When traveling outside Titus County for a city business purpose and other forms of transportation are necessary, the City will reimburse for fees for airport, bus or shuttle service, public transportation including bus service, commuter trains and subways, taxis and ride share. The Mayor and City Council members are expected to select the most economical means of transport available given business and timing requirements.
- Lodging. When traveling outside Titus County for a city business purpose and overnight stay is required, the cost of lodging is reimbursable. Standard costs for lodging in business-related hotels and motels or conference facilities as appropriate to the nature of the business and/or event attendance. This may include parking fees. The City will arrange for attendance at conferences or other municipal events. When making his or her own lodging arrangements, reimbursement will be capped at GSA lodging rates for the area.
- Food and Beverages. When traveling outside Titus County for a city business purpose, the direct costs of meals and tips that are associated with said event, location and travel are reimbursable. The Mayor and Council members are expected to select reasonably priced restaurants and other food and beverage options. The maximum amount that the Mayor and Council member can be reimbursed for such meals and beverages is capped at the City's per diem for employees.
- **Miscellaneous Expenses.** When traveling outside Titus County for a city business purpose, the City will reimburse the costs of faxes, internet connections, required facility fees and other similar business services that are reasonable and necessary if required for City purposes.

Ineligible Expenses

- The City does not assume any liability for any damage or loss to the Mayor or City Council member's vehicle while on city business. The Mayor and City Council members are expected to carry required insurance in accordance with state law.
- Any expenses of a non-business nature.
- Local sales taxes in the State of Texas, excluding meals.
- Personal care items or entertainment such as airline movies or games, in-room movies or games, or sports, amusement or entertainment tickets.
- Expenses for alcoholic beverages.
- Any expenses for spouses or guests.

The City of Mount Pleasant Social Media Terms and Conditions for Users

PURPOSE. Because many of our citizens and other stakeholders utilize social media for news and communications, the City of Mount Pleasant has developed its own social media accounts, which help us inform the public about our work and mission.

The City of Mount Pleasant has an important interest in assuring the accuracy and consistency of information associated with our social media sites. We also respect the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution and the constitutional right to freedom of speech. These terms and conditions establish guidelines for the public's use of social media that balances these values and provide notice to the public of the City of Mount Pleasant's decision to cease and discontinue comment and message features on its social media accounts.

IMPORTANT NOTICE.

Beginning January 2, 2026, the City of Mount Pleasant will cease and discontinue the comment and message feature on its social media accounts such that no comments or messages can be received or posted.

Beginning on January2, 2026, the City of Mount Pleasant will use its social media to distribute information to the public regarding municipal, other government related events or activities and core municipal related events and activities, such as the City of Mount Pleasant, City of Mount Pleasant Economic Development Corporation or Industrial Development Corporation, area school districts, Titus County, Titus County Appraisal District, and other governmental entities and agencies. The City of Mount Pleasant will not use its social media accounts to distribute information about non-municipal, non-governmental or non-core related events or activities.

Citizens and other members of the public are free to attend the City of Mount Pleasant public meetings to address the Council during public comments portion of the meeting. Citizens and other members of the public who are unable to attend the City of Mount Pleasant public meetings may also submit their written comments to be read during the public comments portion of the meeting. Such comments must be submitted by email to [EMAIL] or a letter to the City of Mount Pleasant, Attn. City Secretary, 501 North Madison, Mount Pleasant, Texas 75455-4000 and must be received no later than 24 hours prior to the start of the meeting.

Citizens and other members of the public may also write or email the City of Mount Pleasant regarding any questions or concerns by sending an email to [EMAIL] or a letter to the City of Mount Pleasant, Attn. City Secretary, 501 North Madison, Mount Pleasant, Texas 75455-4000.

All comments or messages posted prior to January 2, 2026 will be maintained on the City's Social Media in accordance with the terms of this policy. Additionally, if the City subsequently decides to allow comments or messages to be posted on its Social Media, all such comments or messages, will be maintained on the City's Social Media in accordance with the terms of this policy.

DEFINITIONS

- 1. "Social media" means digital content created by us and communicated on platforms that allow sharing, commenting, and engagement from the public. Examples of social media accounts we may use are Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, and LinkedIn.
- 2. "Comments" include any digital content, information, links, images, videos, or any other form of communicative content posted in reply or response to a social media account operated by us.
- 3. "User" means a member of the public who views or interacts with one or more of our social media accounts.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- 1. These terms and conditions apply to all our social media sites. Where possible, a link to these terms and conditions will be made available as a hyperlink or posted as text somewhere on our social media account(s).
- 2. Users should know that social media posts we make, comments and replies to those posts, and any direct or private messages sent to us may be public records subject to applicable public records release.
- 3. Our social media accounts are not monitored 24/7 and no one should utilize our social media accounts to seek emergency services. Anyone in need of emergency help should call 9-1-1.
- 4. We do not guarantee we will respond to comments or messages sent on our social media accounts.

EXPECTATIONS

- 1. The leaders of the City of Mount Pleasant believe that honest, civil, and productive discussions provide the best environment for citizens to understand the work of their government and participate in constructive engagement.
- 2. We ask users to consider that our social media feeds may be viewed by children and other impressionable people. Please avoid profanity, personal attacks, bullying, or use of incorrect information.

CONTENT MODERATION

1. **Limited Public Forum**. Our social media accounts are created and maintained as limited public forums under the caselaw pertaining to the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. In the past, we have invited members of the public to view and, where possible, provide comments or other engagement on our social media accounts. However, the law permits us to hide and/or delete comments that are not protected speech under the

First Amendment and relevant case law. As a general rule, we will not hide and/or delete comments solely because such comments are critical of the City of Mount Pleasant or its officials.

- 2. **Prohibited Content**. Relevant First Amendment case law permits us to hide or delete certain comments on our social media accounts. The following will be hidden or deleted per this policy:
 - a. Comments directly advocating violence or illegal activity;
 - b. Comments containing obscenity, which is defined as sexually explicit and/or pornographic content that is (1) patently offensive, (2) appeals to prurient interest, and (3) lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value;
 - c. Comments that directly promote or advocate that we illegally discriminate based on race, age, religion, gender, national origin, disability, sexual orientation, veteran status, or any other legally protected class;
 - d. Comments containing links to malware and/or malicious content that affects the normal functioning of a computer system, server, or browser;
 - e. Duplicate comments to the same post within a short period of time that appear to be autogenerated or generic in nature;
 - f. Defamatory comments either as determined by a court or comments that are patently defamatory by easily discoverable facts;
 - g. Comments that contain images or other content that violate the intellectual property or copyright rights of someone else;
 - h. Comments that contain a hyperlink to any website other than those controlled by the City of Mount Pleasant. This will be done without regard to the viewpoint of the comment containing such a link or the content of the site to which the link redirects.
- 3. **Retention**. When a comment containing any of the above prohibited content is posted to our social media account(s) and is removed according to this policy, a copy or electronic record of that content may be retained or archived pursuant to our records retention policy, along with a brief description of the reason the specific content was deleted. Once documented, the content will be removed, where possible, from our social media account(s).
- 4. **Right of Appeal**. If our staff hides or deletes a user's comment pursuant to these terms and conditions, staff will provide the user with the policy violation. The user has the right to appeal that decision by sending an email to [EMAIL] or a letter to the City of Mount

Pleasant, Attn. City Secretary, 501 North Madison, Mount Pleasant, Texas 75455-4000 within five business days of the removal.

Upon receipt of an appeal, our attorney will determine whether the comment at issue contained content protected by the First Amendment. In the event the city attorney determines that a violation has not occurred, the comment may (if possible) be restored for public view, or the user may be permitted to repost the comment. Upon a determination that the comment was not protected by the First Amendment, the user will be notified that the removal shall stand.

5. **Blocking or Banning a User**. When staff determines that a user has violated these terms and conditions on three or more occasions within a twelve-month rolling period, we may block or ban the offending user from the social media account where the violations occurred until further notice.

If we block or ban a user, we will (a) reasonably attempt to notify the user; (b) describe the violation(s); and (c) explain the appeal process.

In the event it is determined the user has not violated this policy three times within a rolling 12-month period, we will unblock or unban the user from the social media account. Otherwise, our decision will stand.
